Curriculum

Our curriculum is broad and balanced, with core subjects working alongside a wider range of subjects to give students the opportunity to develop and showcase their talents.

All students will cover the core subjects of English, maths and science, alongside English Baccalaureate (EBacc) subjects such as computing, humanities and languages.



We provide a wide range of academic and vocational courses within other subject areas and are continually looking to run courses that cater to our students' interests. This includes a wealth of creative arts subjects, technology-based qualifications, physical education, childcare and computer sciences, plus more besides.

Students are supported to choose subjects that align to their future education and career goals – they are set challenging individual targets, with our curriculum team carefully meeting the needs of all students. This creates an environment that nurtures ability and supports improvement. Our staff guide and continually assess students' progress throughout their time at Holgate, with regular parent contact to help support learning.

Sixth Form

Students attend the Hucknall Sixth Form Centre for their post 16 studies. The centre is a top-class facility with a wide range of academic courses at different levels, giving all students the opportunity to find subjects that match their future education and employment goals.

Enrichment and personal development

We believe that extracurricular activities for students are an important part of academy life. They extend learning, helping our students to develop a range of skill sets and allow them to pursue topics they enjoy.

We have a busy enrichment timetable with a variety of opportunities on offer, such as:

We also run a number of curriculum-based trips and projects throughout the year, as well as in-academy events. Our action-packed science week, for example, has included dissections, a mass eclipse viewing and exciting experiments. Each year, we take part in BBC Young Reporters and have a team of budding academy journalists who interview local politicians, community members, business representatives, celebrities and local sports stars.

Building on our performing arts heritage, students showcase their theatrical talents in a number of highly successful productions which are open to the local community. Other events for students include inter-academy quizzes and debates, sports days and an arts festival, to name a few.

We also offer opportunities for international excursions. These have included language trips to France, ski vacations to Canada and Italy, and science explorations to Iceland and Geneva. We firmly believe that trips like these can both enhance students' learning and give them the opportunity to broaden their horizons.



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Support and guidance

To ensure our students achieve their potential, we place a great emphasis on providing a dedicated support system – covering pastoral care and assistance for specialist educational needs.

New students are integrated seamlessly into life at the academy through our tutor system. Students are placed into one of eight tutor groups in their year group and spend time together each day in these groups.

Together they complete activities based around the academy's ethos – manners, determination and teamwork. It creates an immediate support network with peers and friends, and tutors are able to offer pastoral support and guidance.

When students start at the academy, older students will act as 'buddies' to show them around and answer any questions they may have. All of our new year 7 students will receive peer mentor support when they join us. We recognise that the transition from the primary environment into the secondary one is an important time. Peer mentoring is an effective way of ensuring that all students are able to make that first step successfully. For those who particularly struggle with this transition, we offer twelve places in our accelerated learning facility to provide additional, bespoke support.

We offer an inclusive curriculum that ensures the best possible progress for all of our students, whatever their needs or abilities. All students with special educational needs are fully integrated into the academy.

Students who have additional needs are discussed at transition meetings with the primary feeder schools. Information is shared with staff at the earliest opportunity to support transition work taking place. This includes extra visits and meeting staff and students, where appropriate.

The application process for year 7 normally opens in August each year, closing in late October, with offers made to families in the following March.
