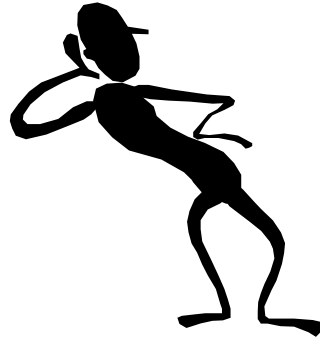

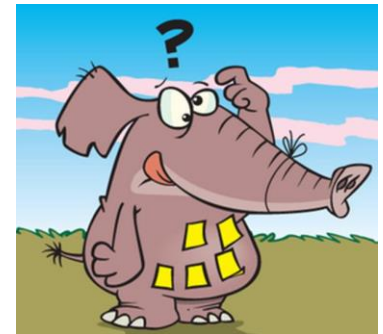

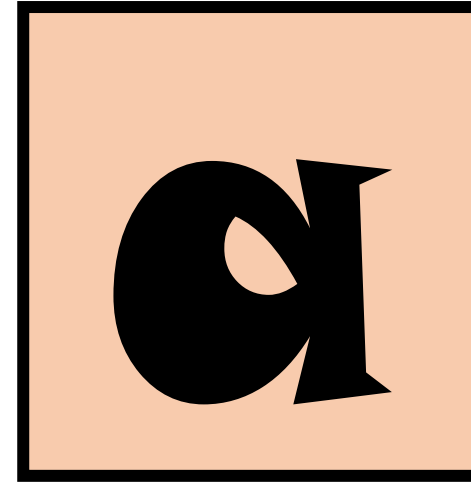

TIPS ON FRENCH PRONOUNCIATION

The sounds that occur on the previous pages are the ones which most frequently can cause problems, so if you can remember how each word sounds, you are a lot closer to having good French pronunciation!

To sum up...

There are several groupings of letters that all make the same sound...

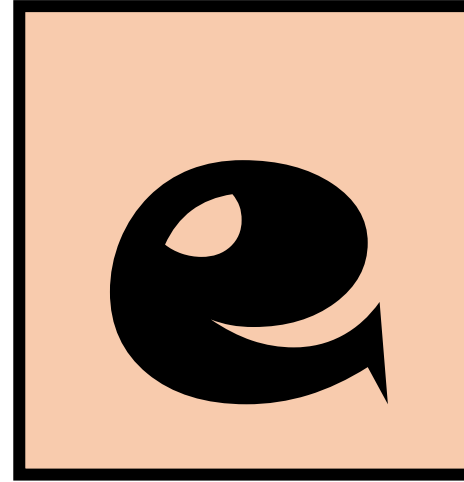
é, er, ez, ais, ait, ay, et, aient – they all sound like **ay** (as in May)

TIPS ON FRENCH PRONOUNTIATION

The letter **c** with an accent underneath – **ç** – sounds like the letter *s* in English

A **c** without this accent, and followed by the letters *o*, *a* or *u*, is a hard sound –
café, *code*, *vecu* (*vaykoo*)

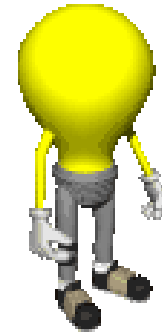
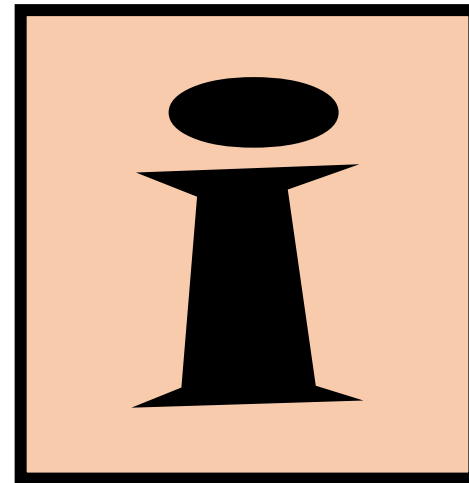
A **c** followed by an *i* or an *e* is soft – *cinq* (*Sank*), *cent* (*Son*)



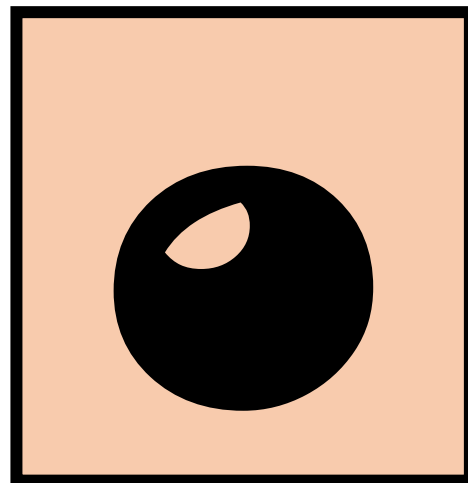
